### How often do busses stop at the bus stops?

Buses run every 15 to 20 mins. depends on the route. The Seminole Express bus service takes you to, around, and from campus to the surrounding Tallahassee area.

Currently The Seminole Express routes are currently unavailable until further notice. Students can ride Star Metro routes throughout the city at no charge with a valid student ID. # As a freshman, how can the Career Center help my student?

The Career Center supports FSU students at every stage of the career development process! We understand that each Seminole's journey is unique, and we are excited to assist as they design their career. The Career Center offers several services to initiate and engage in career planning, such as career advising, exploring majors and careers, searching for a part-time job, and job shadow programs. The Career Center also offers our own elective course (SDS 3340: Intro to Career Development) to help students learn and develop the necessary skills to engage in life/career planning.

### As a parent can I sign up as a mentor on the ProfessioNole platform even if I'm not an alumnus of the university?

# How many FSUPD officers are on campus at any given time?

Each patrol squad (4, two day shifts and two-night shifts) has 9 officers and 2 supervisors. These are sworn members assigned to uniform patrol 24 hours a day. There are other sections within the police department that support patrol, but their primary function is within their section (Investigations, Training, Crime Prevention, etc.)

### HOUSING

### When can my student move into their dorm?

We hope to begin moving students into the halls the week of August 10 and do so through August 23. THIS SCHEDULE COULD CHANGE based upon University decisions responding to current status of COVID and student safety. Students will need to have an appointment to select a move-in time. Students with contracts for Fall will receive an email in July referring them to a link where they can select their day and time for move-in. There will be a limited number of students moving into a hall during each shift, so all students should make sure they have a time reserved.

### Will there be people to help us move into my student's dorm?

No. Due to the risk of exposure for both the volunteers and the students and families, we are not providing volunteer help this year. Each student is asked to bring only 1 vehicle to campus and 2 other guests with you for move in. It is important to not have a large group with you due to the risks of exposure. Housing will provide detailed information regarding move-in on their website for students to review before arrival. Please watch the University Housing Website for updated information.

### Is there anything I need to know about what my student can or cannot have in their dorm room?

Follow the information on the University Housing website for what can and cannot be in rooms. Each student should be prepared to move what they need for isolation for 14 days if they are advised to do so. Keeping a duffel packed with essentials may help make the move easier.

# Is there anything COVID related that I should know about my student's dorm room or residence hall for the fall semester?

Most students will have a roommate and share a bathroom with another pair of students in a suite. Students will be responsible for maintaining the cleanliness in their room / suite / apartment including any sanitization necessary from exposure or quarantine periods. Please make sure they have cleaning supplies to be able to do so. University Staff will sanitize public areas regularly to minimize exposure that may occur.

# How will my student meet their residence hall leader?

The staff in the hall will reach out to each student to get to know them and serve as a support. This is more likely to happen remotely in order to keep everyone at a lower risk of exposure. Your student can go to the front desk area to find office hours, ways to meet with staff or gain information.

### SEMINOLE DINING

# Does my student have to have a meal plan?

No, students are not required to have a meal plan.

## Will all dining halls be open in the fall?

Yes, all dining halls will be open in the fall.

### How do places like Starbucks and the Chick-Fil-A on campus factor into the meal plans?

With the purchase of a meal plan, students also receiving dining dollars. These dining dollars are just like having cash to spend in all our retail locations (any location other that Suwannee, Seminole Café and the FIGG). In all retail locations (expect Starbucks and Argo Tea), you can use 1 meal swipe a day for a \$6 value. If your bill is over \$6, you can pay the difference with your dining dollars.

# Is the 1851 dining hall included in the meal plan?

1851 is considered retail locations and the above will apply to those locations as well.

# What campus dining options are available outside of the meal plan?

All Seminole Dining Locations on campus can be a part of every meal plan from utilizing meal swipes in the dining halls or in a retail location once a day or using your dining dollars that come with your meal plan. All our locations can be accessed even if you do not have a meal plan. You can use dining dollars purchased outside of a meal plan, FSU, credit or debit card.
